CAMPSITE (5=Excellent, 4=Good, 3=OK, 2=Fair, 1=Poor)

Cleanliness – possible 5pt ea

_____ All trails leading to and from campsite and the campsite grounds are clear of trash and debris.

_____ Fire pit clear of debris and raked, and wood is stacked outside of fire pit safely.

_____ Shelter clear of excess dirt, trash and debris, materials organized neatly.

_____ Bag posted at shelter for proper trash disposal.

_____ Evidence of participation in recycling program.

Tents – possible 5pt ea

_____ All adult and youth personal gear stowed away in tents and/or trailer.

_____ All tents uniformly (= all in campsite) open or closed.

_____ Tents taken care of in a Scout-like manner (tent cleanliness & care).

Troop/Patrol Method – possible 5pt ea

_____ First aid kit posted at shelter in an accessible location.

_____ Troop flag clearly posted in campsite.

_____ American flag clearly posted in campsite.

_____ Fireguard chart posted in shelter and filled out to current day ONLY.

_____ Evidence of patrol method (flags, signs, duty roster. Etc.).

Safety – possible 5pt ea

_____ All clothes lines in safe locations and properly used.

_____ No safety hazards in or around campsites.

_____ Flammable materials stored away properly and safely.

Dining Hall – possible 20pt

_____ Dining hall area properly cleaned and checked by Dining Hall Steward after each meal.

EXTRA POINTS (5 points if campsite complies, 0 if the campsite does not)

_____ Something unique or a special camp gadget put together or displayed by the troop (must be Scout related). There must be something significantly new either added to it or made separate each day.

_____ Some evidence of the names and positions of each person in each tent. Both youth and adults (i.e. - routed boards, painted wood, wire, laminated sheets, etc.)
